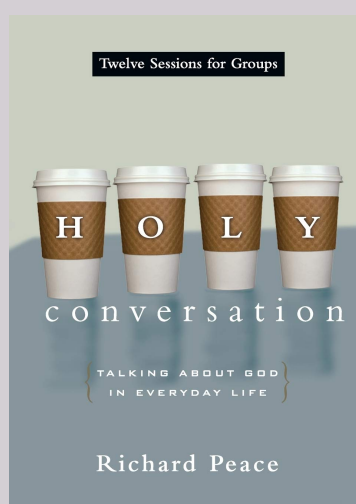
Annual Congregational Meeting Sunday, February 14

Lent Small Group Study *Holy Conversation: Talking About God in Everyday Life*



Perhaps you've heard the joke: "What do you get when you cross a Presbyterian with a Jehovah's Witness?" Give up? Somebody who knocks on the door, but then when the door is answered, just stands there and doesn't say a word!

Just to be clear, this study will **not** be about knocking on the doors of strangers! Rather, it will be about equipping us to be more conversational and comfortable in sharing our faith with friends, family, and colleagues. Who would not want to be a better Christian conversationalist? After all, we know that Jesus wants us to share the Good News. But how do we do it?

If you'd like to be in fellowship with a small group of Christians (no more than 12) who will learn about talking about God in everyday life, you are invited to participate in the Lenten Study: *Holy Conversation*.

The first Zoom meeting will take place on Monday, February 22nd at 2 p.m. and will meet weekly. This study is based on the book *Holy Conversation: Talking About God in Everyday Life*, by Richard Pearce. Although the study is designed to cover 12 sessions, the length of

the study will be determined by the group participants.

Learning happens in the study through a weekly group time of study, reading the book (about 10 minutes per session), and practicing what you've learned with a conversation partner which can take as much or little time as you set aside for it. This study will be facilitated by Ruling Elder, Lynn Kiehne, Pastor Dawn, and Pastor Megan.

We will be accepting applications for college scholarships **February 1st through**

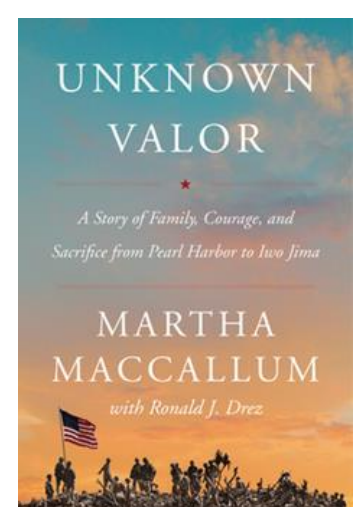
March 3rd. These scholarships include the D T Michael Scholarship and the Ohrns Scholarship for undergraduates and the Osborne Scholarship for Theology students.

For further details about these scholarships, please contact the Church Office. To apply for any of these scholarships, you will need to include: 1) a completed application form (found [HERE](#)); 2) a copy of your most recent high school or college transcript; 3) a 500-word essay describing your involvement in church-related activities as well as extra-curricular and community involvement activities, why you want this grant, and what you expect to do following the completion of your education.

The Scholarship Committee will review the applications and the Session will approve the final awards. Successful applicants will be asked to provide proof of enrollment and acceptance by their educational institution. Funds for the scholarship will be sent directly to the institution so be sure to give the proper name and address to which the funds are to be sent.
