### From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Dearly Beloved,

In one of my sermons in this LOVE SEEN series, I spoke about God loving us through all things. One of you passed me a note after worship: *What is the difference*, you asked, *between being beloved and being respected or accepted?* 

Well, there is a difference between those things, for sure.

I am reminded of a paper I wrote back in seminary. I was doing a course as a chaplain intern in a psychiatric hospital. My paper was about how patients needed to know that you understood and loved them in order for you to be able to help them. The prof, a down-to-earth pipe-smoking dude, read my paper, stroked his chin, looked over his glasses at me and said, sort of slowly: I don't think people want to be understood or loved. I think they want to be enjoyed.

Thinking about that, over the years, I have come to see how different a thing it is: to be understood or even to be loved seems to carry the sense of meeting some standard, while being enjoyed feels like being accepted for who you are. I really like knowing that someone enjoys me, the me I really am. And I think that God does enjoy me. After all, God knows me better than anyone. That seems to be part of the way God loves me.

My friend Nancy tells about how she once spilled a bottle of nail polish on her mom's new carpet. Her mother immediately began cleaning up the mess, without fussing. When the job was done, Nancy's mom said, *From now on let's polish nails in the bathroom.* She still didn't fuss. What a lovely way to parent your child. It would be so easy to sound mad, but that was not her choice.

I think there's a big difference between being respected and/or accepted on the one hand, and being loved on the other. Both are important. But here's the thing (I'm quoting Doug Oldenburg, former president of Columbia Seminary on this): *People don't care how much you know, until they know how much you care.* 

That's true for us. Knowing God cares for us is the first thing and it is true. God cares for us; we are *beloved*. Then, being honest and worthy is what we try to

offer in response, in our love for this loving God.

All children Pre-K through 5th grade are welcome! Sunday mornings at 10 AM in Room S-202; runs through May 26



## Health Kits and Healthy Teeth for Honduras For Our Next Mission Sunday On May 19, 2024

Our Mission Committee is once again partnering with our Honduras team for their upcoming trip June 9-16, 2024. For this Mission Sunday, we need toothbrushes for both adults and children.

We also need spooled dental floss, waxed or

unwaxed (but *NOT* the plastic "pick" kind that can create litter in Honduras). Also needed are Band-aids for adults and children. And if you're unable to bring any of these items, \$\$money\$\$ will work just fine (make checks out to FPC and mention Honduras trip in the memo line).

Collection boxes labeled "For Honduras" will be below each of the Giving Trees in the Youth Center and the Sanctuary.

The assembled health kits will be distributed in each of the five villages visited by our team where they perform health screenings for adults and offer activities for children.
