From the Desk of Pastor Ginny

Beloved ones,

RED! Red is the code word for this week: PENTECOST 2024 is this Sunday! Pentecost is the day when the Holy Spirit came upon the church with the sound of a violent wind, with what looked like tongues of flame resting on the heads of the disciples, with unexpected power enabling those country bumpkin disciples to suddenly speak in languages they didn't even know. Wow. What a day that was!

It is the memory of the FLAMES that made the Christian church choose RED as the color for Pentecost. So I will be wearing my red stole. We will have red banners and red flounces in the church. I invite each of you to wear red: a shirt, or dress, or tie or scarf, or whatever. (Some like to wear red shoes! red socks! that works) Maybe even those of you who need to watch our live-stream at home can wear red. Gosh, maybe we need red cupcakes....

But more than the color: we may need a little excitement, a bit of surprise. Why? Because our God is a GOD OF SURPRISES!

That's why there was the sound of a violent wind. That's why, one day, Moses saw a bush burning but not burned up. When Moses turned aside to see what was going on, God spoke to him and sent him in a whole new direction in his life. That's why a young woman was chosen to bear a child who would be the son of God. (She then went a whole new direction in her life too!)

We Presbyterians believe that the power of the Holy Spirit has not been used up. It has not gone away. If we are open to it, we may see and feel and find in ourselves the power, the excitement, the exuberance that accompany the Holy Spirit. We might find ourselves a little surprised!

ONE MORE THING: Remember this Pentecost Sunday is also our Mission Sunday. Between the worship services, from 10:00 to 11:00, everybody is asked to come to the Fellowship Hall (downstairs, off the back parking lot) to help prepare items that are going with our Mission Team to Honduras in early June. It's not hard work, but it is important and needed, and you will make new friends as you work. Adults and children will find things to do.

Health Kits & Healthy Teeth for Honduras Mission Sunday: This Sunday,

May 19, 2024

Our Mission Committee is once again partnering with our Honduras team for their upcoming trip June 9-16, 2024. For this Mission Sunday, we need toothbrushes for both adults and children. We also need spooled dental floss, waxed or unwaxed (but *NOT* the plastic "pick" kind that can create litter in Honduras). Also needed are Bandaids for adults and children. And if you're unable



to bring any of these items, \$\$money\$\$ will work just fine (make checks out to FPC and mention Honduras trip in the memo line).

Collection boxes labeled "For Honduras" will be below each of the Giving Trees in the Youth Center and the Sanctuary.

The assembled health kits will be distributed in each of the five villages visited by our team where they perform health screenings for adults and offer activities for children.



So how can you help in addition to providing the items above? Our Mission Committee needs many hands this Mission Sunday to remove all donated items from their packaging and then to bag the items in zip lock bags. As usual, committee members will be there to offer guidance.

PLEASE NOTE: Also NOT needed are toothpaste and soap because of the additional weight to the Honduras team members' baggage. These items will be purchased in Honduras.

Wednesday Night Dinner Cookout - what fun!


