Their recommendations were recently submitted to a "Revitalization Team" and they stem from the prayers, hearts, thoughtful minds, and months of work of these task force members.


The Revitalization Team took the reports and recommendations from each of the sub-task forces (as well as other interested members of the church family), categorized them by subject as well as impact and cost, and came up with a final list of recommendations for the session. Remarkably (and admirably), the longest list of things we can do to revitalize and grow our church are things which are "doable" now, at little or no cost. We would like to share these recommendations with our congregation on September 11.

Ten Commandments




Presbyterian Women's Bible study for


