





Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs)

Have You Ever Considered Making a Charitable Gift From Your IRA?

If you are over the age of 70 1/2, perhaps you should!

Here is a tax-savvy strategy that allows you to transfer up to \$100,000 per year from your traditional IRA directly to qualified charities, such as your church.



If you are 70½, it is tax smart to fund your charitable gifts by Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCDs). These reduce your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) which may also reduce your Federal taxes, and surcharges on Medicare and Part D Drug Plans.

Any amount processed as a QCD counts toward your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) and reduces the taxable amount of your traditional IRA distribution.

If you are over age 70 1/2, consider taking advantage of the QCD. If you aren't at that age yet, consider how you can intentionally position yourself to take advantage of these rules once you do turn 70 1/2. Start by evaluating how much you save in tax-advantaged accounts and how you spend your savings to support your retirement lifestyle. By using, or preparing to use, a QCD, you can meet your RMD requirement, satisfy your charitable intents, all while saving money on taxes both today and into the future.

Most brokerage firms will assist you with these transactions, only requiring that you provide the name, address, and other pertinent information about the charities. From there they will either disburse the checks directly to the charities, or send the checks to you to pass along. There are no IRS limitations on how many or how small the distributions may be to your favorite charities (other than the \$100,000 total per year limit), so it only depends on your brokerage firm and any limitations they may have.

Be safe this Holiday Season. Some of the more common Holiday Hazards are:

- Medications Be sure visitors in your home put their medications in a locked area where children can't get them.
- **Batteries** Small batteries can cause blockages if lodged in the ear, nose, throat, stomach or intestines. Acid burns can occur if batteries open inside the body.
- Alcohol Ethanol found in liquor, perfume, mouthwash and hand sanitizers can be
 poisonous. After just a couple of swallows, it may cause a drop in blood sugar
 leading to confusion, convulsions or coma.
