Volunteer At Free Clinic's 'We Help' Pantry

The We Help Services Food Pantry is currently in need of volunteers to work four hour shifts Monday through Friday 8 a.m.- 4 p.m., and Thursday from 8 a.m.- 8 p.m.

Opportunities include working at the front desk and hygiene counter and guiding clients through the pantry. Volunteers must be 16 years old, and it is preferred that you commit to a minimum of 3 months volunteer service.

The Free Clinic Health Center is also looking for dentists to assist with its ongoing dental clinics. Dentists must have an active license in the state of Florida and commit to volunteering during at least one dental clinic, which is typically a half-day commitment.
