Men's Meal Ministry Needs Your Support

With the support of our church, the men's meal ministry prepares nearly 200 hot meals each month for Pinellas Hope, where over 150 homeless men and women are living. Using the church kitchen in the Fellowship Hall, 6 to 8 men prepare over 80 pounds of meatloaf, servings of mashed potatoes, green beans, salad and a small dessert. The food is then delivered to Pinellas Hope and served by church volunteers. This is accomplished on a relatively small monthly budget of only \$500.
